THE COACHES

Union College Coach **John Audino** has a record of 120-40 with five appearances in the NCAA Division III playoffs and four ECAC Northwest Championships. He is the first football coach to win 100 games in Union history. The Dutchmen returned to the NCAA playoffs for the second straight year in 2006. Audino and his staff won the Liberty League Coaching Staff of the Year Award for the second year in a row. RB Tom Arcidiacono was a finalist for the Gagliardi Trophy and played in the Aztec Bowl. Entering 2007, Audino ranked 18th among active NCAA Division III coaches in winning percentage and 24th all-time in winning percentage. He was tied for 18th among active coaches in career wins, which includes eight victories at Kean. Audino is 9-6 in his career against RPI. **Joe King** is in his 19th season with RPI, and enters this week with a 117-45-2 record. This game marks the coaches with the most wins and best winning percentage in the storied histories of the two programs. Audino has a winning percentage of 75%, and King stands at 72%.

THE WINNING CONTINUES

Union is assured of another non-losing season, as the Dutchmen have posted a .500 or better record in each of Coach John Audino's 16 seasons. A total of 14 of his 16 seasons have featured winning records.

THE SERIES VS. THE ENGINEERS

New York State's oldest collegiate rivalry continues this week. This is the 105th meeting in the series between Rensselaer and Union. The series is the fifth oldest in NCAA Division III and 16th longest in terms of games played in NCAA Div. III. According to the Union record books, the Dutchmen hold a 78-22-4 lead in the series. This will be the 58th meeting since the introduction of "The Dutchman Shoes Trophy." Union is 44-13 in the series since the introduction of the trophy. the 2005 meeting in November was the first in the month since 1957. Union states that the series began with a 4-0 win over RPI in Albany on Nov. 19, 1886. The Dutchmen have won six straight home meetings, last losing at Bailey Field to RPI on October 17, 1992.

LAST SEASON VS. RPI

In the 104th meeting between Union and RPI in football, the host Engineers won 24-19 at '86 Field on Nov. 11. The Dutchmen ended a seven-game winning streak and finished 5-1 in the Liberty League, but had wrapped up the league's automatic NCAA bid prior to this contest. RPI was led by RB Jay Bernardo, who had 134 yards and a touchdown on 30 carries. WR Brendan McGowan had 109 yards and a TD on 13 catches, while QB Jimmy Robertson was 21 for 35 for 211 yards and two TDs with one interception. Union WRs Ryan Twitchell and Steve Angiletta each had 121 yards in receptions on the day, with Twitchell making seven receptions and Angiletta posting six. RB Tom Arcidiacono had 115 yards on 24 rushes, giving him over 100 yards in each of Union's nine regular season games. QB Anthony Marotti completed 17 of 37 for 268 yards and a TD but was intercepted three times. Defensively, Union was led by LB Kevin Flike, who had a game high 12 tackles, including six solo, and an interception with a pass deflection. CB Adam LoGuidice and LB Armin Warner each had nine tackles for the Engineers.

LAST WEEK VS. HOBART

QB Andrew Strom threw for three TDs and 210 yards and the Hobart defense held Union to 89 yards rushing in a 30-20 Liberty League football victory at Frank Bailey Field Saturday. With the win, the Statesmen tied Union with 5-1 league records, and improved to 7-2 overall. The Dutchmen had a five game winning streak snapped and fell to 5-3 overall. RB Anthony Hobaica rushed for 70 yards and a TD for Hobart, while LB Justin Hager recorded 11 tackles and two for losses. LB Ryan Robinson had eight tackles and two for losses and TE Matt Duliba had six catches for 67 yards. WR Charles Kaliades had six catches for 72 yards for the Dutchmen, while QB Andrew Cattelier was 12 for 21 with 111 yards and Jared Gourrier was six for 11 with 46 yards. Union LB Mike Wess had 10 solo tackles, a pass deflection, a pass break up and a sack. The Statesmen had 326 total yards in offense while allowing 246 for the day.

LIBERTY LEAGUE STAT NOTES



In Liberty League statistics, the Dutchmen lead the league in pass defense and pass def. efficiency, and are second in scoring defense, opponent first downs and total defense. Union has allowed 58 passing first downs, the fewest in the league. RB Zach Tillo is fifth in rushing, and K Zach Epley is fourth in field goals per game. He has made all five of his attempts, the only kicker in the league with a minimum of five to make all attempts. DE Chuck Pinckney is tied for the league lead in sacks, is first in fumbles recovered and is fourth in tackles for losses. LB Joseph Catalano is third in tackles per game.

AN AMAZING RUN OF LEAGUE SUCCESS

Union has an opportunity to win a third straight Liberty League championship, with a victory and a Rochester win vs. Hobart. The Dutchmen have won 19 of their last 21 Liberty League games.

SENIOR DAY FOR 18 DUTCHMEN

A total of 18 Union seniors will play their final regular season home game today. This season's seniors have a four year record in league play of 24-3 (89%), with two league championships and two NCAA playoff appearances.

A WESS COAST DEFENSE

Senior linebacker Mike Wess had 10 primary tackles last week, the most solo hits since John Peters had 14 in the opener. Wess and LB Chuck Pinckney are candidates for the *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-America teams, and Wess was selected Academic All-District in '06.

ZONING IN

Union has scored on 23 of 27 attempts inside the red zone this season, a success rate of 85%. The Dutchmen defense has held opponents to a success rate of 54%.

VITO AND #43

LB Vito Pellerito is the 13th player to record 200 career tackles, and has 234 to rank 7th, seven behind Mario Maltese. Pellerito has averaged over eight tackles during the last six games.

HUSH THE RUSH

Union has not allowed more than 116 yards rushing over the last six games. Hobart, with 116, was the first opponent since Muhlenberg to record over 100 yards rushing.

INTERCEPTIONS ARE QUITE INCOGNITO

QB Andrew Cattelier did not throw an interception in his first 78 pass attempts this season, and has just one in 86 attempts. Union QB's have only eight in eight games.

SOME VERY OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

Union may have been the only team in the NCAA to lose the all-time career passing, receiving and rushing leaders, yet this season Union is averaging 296.2 yards per game, and 348.7 over the last six games.
