The Dutchmen wrap up their six-game road trip at Providence before returning to Messa Rink to host Northeastern in the first contest of a three-game homestand. The Dutchmen snapped a seven-game winless streak and picked up their first league and road win of the season last Friday with a 4-3 win at Quinnipiac. Union plays four non-conference games to close out the first half of the season.

Last Time Out: Union snapped a seven-game winless streak with a 4-3 win at Quinnipiac last Friday. It marked the first win over the Bobcats in the last six games, and the first-ever victory over QU in Connecticut. The following night, however, Union got out to a slow start and the Dutchmen's rally fell short in a 4-3 loss at Princeton.

Prez Helps Out: Freshman Adam Presizniuk led the team last weekend with four points, all assists. The forward picked up his first career multiple-point game with three assists at Quinnipiac, and added another at Princeton. Presizniuk ranks second on the team with six points (1-5-6). He was named to the ECAC Hockey Weekly Honor Roll for his efforts.

Offensive Outburst: The Dutchmen scored seven goals last weekend, the highest weekend total since January 26-27, 2007 (8 goals).

Walters Leads the Way: Jason Walters leads the team with seven points on two goals and five assists. The sophomore recorded his team-leading third multiple-point game at Princeton with a pair of assists.

Shooting Gallery: Union has outshot opponents in nine of 11 games this season and hold a 325-296 shot advantage. The Dutchmen have outshot ECAC Hockey opponents 193-146.

Coyle Contributions: Senior Josh Coyle returned to the lineup against UMass on 11/25 and has recorded a pair of power-play goals in the last three games. Coyle has registered one minor penalty since returning to the lineup. Union is 2-2-2 with Coyle in the lineup this season. The winger was injured in the season opener against Ferris State.

Road Win: Union's win at Quinnipiac last Friday snapped a nine-game road losing streak, dating back to January 27, 2007. Union's longest road losing streak spanned 13 games from November 13, 1992-March 6, 1993.

Sweet Messa Rink: The Dutchmen are unbeaten at Messa Rink this season (2-0-2). Union was 7-6-2 at home last season and 10-5-4 at Messa Rink in 2005-06.

Positively Speaking: Despite being outscored, 33-22, this season, four Dutchmen have maintained a positive plus-minus rating. Andrew Buote leads the way at +2, while Stephane Boileau, Chris Potts and Sam Bowles are all +1.

Powering Up: The Dutchmen went 2-for-7 on the power play last weekend, improving their season total to 7-for-55 (12.7%). Union ranks eighth in the league and 43rd nationally.

How About Buote: Freshman Andrew Buote picked a great time for his first career goal. The forward registered the game-winner at Quinnipiac Friday when he tipped in a Lane Caffaro slapshot from the point in the third period.

Back Cook-in: Junior captain Matt Cook broke an eight-game scoreless streak with a goal at Princeton Saturday. The winger had four points with a goal and three helpers in Union's first two games of the season. The Dutchmen are 2-1-0 when Cook nets a point.

Deux Pour Boileau: Stephane Boileau had two assists at Quinnipiac Friday in his second career multiple-point game. The rookie stands with five points with a goal and four assists. He had previously recorded two assists against Ferris State on 10/13.

Harr'd Work Pays Off: Mike Harr's assist at Princeton Saturday marked the first point for the junior in 16 games. His last point came against on Union's empty-netter at Brown on January 26, 2007. Union is 3-1 when Harr nets a point over the past two seasons.

Streaked: Union snapped its seven-game winless streak with a win at Quinnipiac last Friday. It marked the longest streak since a seven-game streak from 1/14/05- 2/1/05.

Torren Tearing It Up: Senior Torren Delforte scored his fourth goal of the season at Quinnipiac last Friday, matching his season total from his junior year. The winger is averaging .36 goals per game, and is tied for the team lead in goals.

Super Mario: Sophomore Mario Valery-Trabucco picked up three points last weekend with a two goals and an assist, earning a spot on the ECAC Hockey Weekly Honor Roll. He scored Union's third goal at Quinnipiac, and netted a goal and a helper at Princeton Saturday. He was plus-1 and recorded a team-high eight shots on the weekend. Valery-Trabucco has four goals and two assists this season, and leads the team with three goals in ECAC Hockey play.

Thinking Outside the Box: Union has registered 54.9% fewer penalty minutes through the first 11 games this season compared to last season's first 11 games. The Dutchmen have been whistled for 68 penalties (147 minutes), compared to 123 penalties (268 minutes) in last season's first 11 games. Union is averaging 13.36 penalty minutes per game this season, the fifth lowest average in the league and the 23rd-lowest nationally.

Friars Connection: A 1990 Providence graduate, Union Associate Head Coach Rick Bennett was a four-year standout for the Friars at left wing and ranks 24th all-time in scoring with 134 points (50 goals, 84 assists). He earned Second-Team All-American honors as a junior, and as a senior captain for the Friars earned Second-Team All-Hockey East accolades and was a Hobey Baker Finalist. Bennett was also named to the Hockey East All-Freshman Team in 1987. Bennett returned to his alma mater in 2001 to being a five-year stint as the Friars' assistant coach. During his tenure Bennett coached the team's power play, handled team travel, recruiting, and academics. Bennett worked with the team's defense his first two seasons before transitioning to forwards for his final three seasons behind the bench.

A Look at the Friars: The Friars come into the weekend after an 8-0 win over Brown on Tuesday that saw 11 Providence players register at least one point. Backed by senior goal-tender Tyler Simms, the Friars have not allowed a goal in the past two games while outshooting their opponents, 88-38. Sims has started 10 games with a 4-5-1 record including three shutout wins to accompany his 2.18 GAA and .916 save percentage. Defenseman Matt Taormina paces the offense and leads the nation's defenders in points per game, averaging 1.15 points per game. The junior has a pair of short-handed tallies and stands with 15 points on five goals and 10 assists. Senior co-captain Jon Rheault had a goal and a pair of assists against Brown to bring his season total to seven goals and seven helpers. Junior forward Pierce Norton ranks second in Hockey East with four power-play goals, and leads his team with eight goals overall this season. Norton has also picked up five assists for 13 points. The Friars' power play ranks third in the nation at 25.9% (15-for-58). Providence opened the season with a pair of losses to ECAC Hockey opponents, falling 4-1 to a hot St. Lawrence before being shut out by Clarkson, 2-0.

Union vs. Providence: The two teams meet for the first time since a 5-2 Providence win on Oct. 11, 2002...The Friars hold a 6-1-1 lead in the all-time series that dates back to 1994. Union is 0-4-0 all-time in Providence, and picked up its only win in the series with a 2-0 victory in Schenectady on Nov. 1, 1996. Head Coach Nate Leaman has never faced Providence.

A Look at the Huskies: 12/13th-ranked Northeastern comes into the weekend on a seven-game unbeaten streak. The Huskies sit atop Hockey East with a 6-3-1 league record, including a key 4-3 overtime win at Boston College on Nov. 23. Northeastern brings a young team to Messa Rink, with only two seniors and 10 upperclassmen overall. Junior forward Joe Vitale's 13 points on five goals and eight assists leads the team which is 3-0 on the road this season. All of Vitale's points have come in Hockey East games. Three other Huskies stand with eight points on the season. Sophomore Brad Thiessen has started all 12 games, posting a 2.54 GAA and a .910 save percentage – about middle of the pack in the Hockey East rankings. The Huskies are 9-for-72 on the power play this season (12.5%), and stand with an 83.9% penalty kill (52-for-62).

Union vs. Northeastern: The Huskies hold a 3-2-1 lead in the all-time series that dates back to 1931. Northeastern has won the last two meetings, both of which were in Boston. The Huskies dominated last season's game at Matthews Arena, netting three first-period scores en route to a 5-0 win in a game that featured 110 penalty minutes. Union's last win in the series came as a 5-3 victory at Messa Rink on December 29, 2001. The Dutchmen are undefeated vs. the Huskies in Schenectady (1-0-1). Head Coach Nate Leaman is 0-1-0 all-time vs. Northeastern.

Up Next: Union wraps up the first half of the season with a pair of games at Messa Rink against Nebraska-Omaha next weekend. The Dutchmen then play three exhibition games at University of New Brunswick from 12/28-30. Union will play the New Brunswick Varsity Reds at 7 p.m. Friday before playing in the Pete Kelly Cup. The Dutchmen will face St. Thomas (NB) on Saturday at 4 p.m. in the first round of the tournament and then will vie against host New Brunswick or Acadia on 12/30.

Cain Out: Freshman left winger Luke Cain suffered a season-ending injury in the third period at Dartmouth on Nov. 9. The rookie had three points with two goals and an assist through the first seven games of the season.

Fit to Be Tied: The Dutchmen started the league season with a pair of ties for the first time in program history on Nov. 2-3. Union's record for ties in a season is six, set in the 2001-02 season and again matched in 2005-06. The Dutchmen posted a record four ties in league play in the 2005-06 season.

Head Coach Nate Leaman: Leaman returns for his fifth season behind the Union bench. He stands as the all-time winningest coach in Union's Division I history and third-most winningest coach in program history. Leaman (60-80-18) trails Bruce Delventhal (89-111-21) and Charlie Morrison (122-146-9) on the all-time list.

Bennett Promoted: Rick Bennett was promoted to Associate Coach in the offseason. Bennett, who is in his third year with the Dutchmen, served as the Dutchmen's acting head coach in December of 2006 in a pair of games at the Sheraton/TD Banknorth Catamount Cup when Leaman was serving as an assistant coach for the U.S. National Junior Team at the IIHF World Junior Championships in Sweden. Bennett led the Dutchmen to a 5-1 win over RPI, marking the largest margin of victory over the cross-town rival since 1924. He works with Union's defensemen and assists with special teams while serving as an integral member of the recruiting staff and managing team video.

The Scott Richardson Unsung Hero Award: The Union College men's hockey team renamed its Unsung Hero Award during the first intermission of the Dutchmen's game against Yale on November 3, in honor of Scott Richardson '86, who passed away suddenly this summer. Richardson was a four-year letterwinner for the Dutchmen who exemplified the true meaning of an unsung hero. Fundraisers to benefit the college fund of Richardson's two daughters raised over \$3,600.

Baker Inducted into Union Athletics Hall of Fame: During the second period intermission of the Dutchmen's game against Yale on Saturday, November 3, Union recognized Steve Baker '85, who was inducted into the Union Athletics Hall of Fame that afternoon. Baker was the first Union hockey player to play in the NHL and also the first to have his name engraved on the Stanley Cup. Baker is the second hockey player to be inducted into the Union Athletics Hall of Fame; Wayne McDougall '86 was inducted in 2005.

Other members of the Union Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2007 include the 1971-72 Men's Basketball Team, Gretchen (Voegler) Belanger '97 (volleyball), Harold Enstice '48 (baseball, basketball and football), John Keller '91 (lacrosse), Marco Lainez '94 (football), Bob Ridings (Equipment Manager) and Kevin Scheuer '79 (track and field).

Dutchmen on Television: Seven Union hockey games, including five at Messa Rink, are scheduled to be televised this season on Time Warner Sports, which may be found on Time Warner Cable Channel 3 in the Capital District. Home games include Cornell (1/12), RPI (1/18), Harvard (2/8), Clarkson (2/22) and St. Lawrence (2/23). "The Skates Game" at rival RPI (1/19) and Union's game at St. Lawrence (1/25) will also be featured on Time Warner Sports. Selected games will also be available on SNY throughout New York State.

HEAD COACH NATE LEAMAN

FIFTH SEASON

Union's 15th head coach and fourth leader behind the bench since the program moved to the Division I level prior to the 1991 season, Nate Leaman enters his fifth season as the head coach of the Dutchmen.

Leaman became the winningest coach in Union's Division I history on December 30, 2006, with his 51st victory in a 5-1 win over Rensselaer. Leaman finished the season with 57 career wins, placing him third on the all-time wins list in program history.

He led the Dutchmen to a winning home record for the second consecutive season in 2006-07, including two wins over nationally-ranked opponents at Messa Rink. He guided Union to a program-record 46 power-play goals and the highest power-play percentage of his tenure.

Leaman also served as an assistant coach for the 2007 U.S. National Junior Team, helping the team to a bronze medal finish at the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship in Sweden.

Leaman has been active in USA Hockey, also serving as an assistant coach on the U.S. National Under-18 team that captured gold at the 2005 IIHF World U-18 Championship in Plzen, Czech Republic. He coached teams at USA Hockey's Select 14 Player Development Camp in 2001 and 2002, and served as head coach for Team Massachusetts at USA Hockey's 2003 Select 16 Festival. He also made several presentations on different coaching topics and philosophies at USA Hockey Coaches Symposiums from 1999 to 2003.

In 2005-06, Leaman led Union to a program record-tying 16 wins and to victories over four nationally-ranked teams, including the Dutchmen's first-ever win over a top-five team when Union handed a 2-1 loss to No. 5-ranked Cornell in mid-November. Union also earned its fourth straight ECACHL home playoff series.

Leaman led Union to its best Division I start in his first season as the team opened the 2003-04 campaign with a five-game unbeaten streak and six wins in the first eight games. His team had the best non-conference record in the ECAC and ranked 10th in the country having killed off 161 penalties in 187 chances (.861).

During his tenure at Union, Leaman has coached an All-ECACHL player, the ECAHL's Student-Athlete of the Year as well as a CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District Honoree.

Leaman came to Union after four seasons as an assistant coach on Mark Mazzoleni's staff at Harvard where he served as the team's top assistant and recruiting coordinator during his final season.

Under Mazzoleni, Leaman was part of a staff that helped rebuild the Harvard program into one of the top teams in the ECAC, taking the team from eighth place in the league to an ECAC tournament championship and NCAA appearance in 2001-2002, and an ECAC runner-up finish and NCAA appearance in 2002-2003.

A vital part of the staff at Harvard, Leaman was the architect side in Clifton Park, N.Y.

of the Crimson's special teams play, playing a key role in developing the team's power play and the penalty kill, as well as working with the Harvard forwards. Also among his duties at Harvard was video editing and review.

During his four years on the Harvard coaching staff, Leaman had a hand in recruiting 13 NHL draft picks, and helped the program to be consistently ranked near the top of college hockey in the number of players with NHL rights.

Prior to joining the staff in Cambridge, Leaman served as a volunteer



assistant coach under Shawn Walsh at the University of Maine in 1998-99. In helping guide Maine to a 31-6-4 record and the 1999 NCAA Championship, Leaman's responsibilities included working with the Black Bears' defense, video analysis, on-campus recruiting and monitoring of the players' academic progress. While in Orono, Leaman earned a Master of Science degree in biological sciences in 1999.

In his short career behind the bench, Leaman has already coached 16 NHL draft picks, four All-Americans and one Hobey Baker finalist.

Before joining the staff at Maine, Leaman served as associate coach for one season at Old Town High School in Old Town, Maine, where he was responsible for the design and implementation of team practices and bench management during games.

Leaman is a 1997 graduate of Cortland State University (N.Y.), where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in biological sciences with a concentration in environmental science and received the Aldo Leopold Award for excellence in environmental science. Captain of the hockey team as a junior and senior, Leaman finished his career as one of the top 20 scorers in Red Dragons' history.

Prior to attending Cortland, Leaman spent a season with the Enkoping Sports Klubb in Enkoping, Sweden, and also played one year with the Indianapolis Junior Ice in the North American Junior Hockey League.

A native of Centerville, Ohio, Leaman and his wife, Alice, reside in Clifton Park, N.Y.

Associate Coach Rick Bennett Third Season



Rick Bennett begins his first season as associate coach and third as a member of the Dutchmen staff. Bennett previously spent five years as an assistant coach at Providence College. His first two years with the Friars he worked with the defense and then worked with the forwards his final three seasons. During his tenure Bennett also coached the team's power play, handled team travel, recruiting, and academics.

Last summer, Bennett guided the United States' Team Blue to the championship of the U-17 Three Nations Tournament, held at the ESL Sports Centre in Rochester, N.Y. from August 14 through 18. His team compiled a 3-1-0 record throughout the tournament, while outscoring opponents, 24-8. Bennett also served as a coach at the U.S. Select 16 National Festival in Rochester, NY, in the summer of 2005.

A 1990 graduate of Providence, Bennett was a four-year standout for the Friars at left wing and ranks 21st all-time in scoring with 134 points (50 goals, 84 assists). He earned Second-Team All-American honors as a junior, and as a senior captain for the Friars earned Second-Team All-Hockey East accolades and was a Hobey Baker Finalist. Bennett was also named to the Hockey East All-Freshman Team in 1987. He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in general studies.

Bennett was a third round draft pick of the Minnesota North Stars in the 1986 NHL Entry Draft and was traded to the New York Rangers his junior year at Providence. From 1990-93, he played for the Binghamton Rangers of the AHL and saw action in 15 games for the New York Rangers. After leaving Binghamton, he spent two seasons with the Springfield Indians of the AHL and played his final four seasons of professional hockey (1995-99) for the Jacksonville Lizard Kings (ECHL) and the Pee Dee Pride (ECHL). In addition to playing for the Lizard Kings and the Pride, Bennett also served as an assistant coach for each team for four years.

Bennett works with the defensemen and special teams, manages team video and is an active member of the recruiting staff.

Assistant Coach Bill Riga Fifth Season

Bill Riga enters his fifth season as an assistant coach with the Dutchmen after seven seasons in the Boston Junior Bruins organization in Framingham, Mass. Riga served as an Associate Head Coach/Recruiting Coordinator, as well as a strength coach and video coordinator during his tenure with the Junior Bruins. During his final season with the organization, Riga helped lead the Bruins to 55 victories and a 30-7-4 record in the Eastern Junior Hockey League (EJHL). Nine players



from the 2002-2003 Junior Bruin team signed Division I letters of intent.

While working in the Junior Bruins organization, Riga founded the Junior Bruins Power Skating School and was a Junior Bruins Hockey Schools instructor. Working with players between the ages of 8-20, Riga was responsible for recognizing and cultivating some of the most talented young hockey players on the East coast. He was also one of founders of the prestigious Beantown Classic Hockey Tournament.

Riga also served as Head Coach and Director of Hockey for two seasons (2000-2002) at the Rivers School in Weston, MA, and was involved with several college summer leagues and regional tournaments throughout the year. From 2000-2003, Riga honed his administrative skills as the Director of Media Relations and website maintainer for the EJHL.

Prior to joining the Junior Bruins organization, Riga played one season for the El Paso Buzzards in the Western Professional Hockey League under Head Coach Todd Brost.

Riga graduated from the University of Massachusetts at Lowell in 1996 with a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise physiology. A Dean's List student-athlete at Lowell, Riga helped lead the River Hawks to a four-year record of 88-56-13, four Hockey East final fours and two NCAA final eight appearances. A Hockey East All-Academic Team selection, Riga was awarded the 1996 Gus Coutu Award, presented to the River Hawk player that best demonstrates the spirit of UMass Lowell Hockey. Riga attended St. Mark's School in Southboro, MA, prior to Lowell.


